

Constance Woolson Brand Collection Notes and Inventory

Constance Woolson Brand, the daughter of Herman Hans Brand and Maude Elle Woolson, was born in Toledo on October 25, 1902. Her father was a prominent banker and active in several clubs, including the Toledo Club and the Toledo Country Club. He was the son of Alvin Brand, an emigrant from Germany and also a prominent Toledo businessman in his day. Constance's mother was the daughter of Alvin Woolson of the Woolson Spice Company in Toledo.

Constance never married. She apparently did not work for pay but volunteered for the American Red Cross. She was a member of the Riverside Hospital Auxiliary and the U.S. Navy Auxiliary of World War II. She died on October 26, 1968 at the age of 66 and was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery.
