

Edward Carder Ames Collection Biographical Notes

Edward Carder Ames (1907-1987)

Edward Carder Ames, a retired vice-president of Owens-Illinois and a former instructor at the University of Toledo, was born in Riverside, Illinois. He graduated cum laude from the University of Chicago with his bachelor's degree. He obtained his masters degree in medieval history from Harvard University in 1927. Ames taught at Ohio Wesleyan University from 1927 to 1929 and at the University of Toledo from 1934 to 1938. While teaching at UT, Ames authored a college textbook, *English in Business and Engineering*. In 1940 Ames joined Owens-Corning Fiberglas Corp. He was its public relations director for much of his 13-year career with the firm. He joined Owens-Illinois in 1954. There he served first as public relations director and then administrative vice-president until his retirement in 1971.

Mr. Ames was very active in civic affairs. He twice served as the president of the Toledo School Board, was elected to the State Board of Education, and served as its president from 1968-69. Ames was also an active member of the Toledo Rotary Club and was a licensed lay reader at St. Michael-in-the-Hills Episcopal Church.

Ames was a close friend and an occasional traveling companion of Grove Patterson. The two were close until Patterson's death in 1956, at which time Ames assisted Ester Patterson with her responses to the many letters of sympathy, which she had received.

Grove H. Patterson (1881-1956)

Grove Hiram Patterson, the *Toledo Blade's* editor-in-chief since 1946, was born in Rochester, Minnesota. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Oberlin College in 1905. In 1909 he joined the staff of the *Toledo Times*, only to be fired the following year. He joined the *Blade* staff in 1910 as a news editor. A series of promotions followed: He was made executive editor in 1920, editor in 1926, and finally editor-in-chief in 1946. Patterson also wrote a column for the *Blade*, "The Way of the World." Many of his columns concerning his various trips abroad have been compiled into books. His autobiography, *I Like People*, was printed in 1954. Patterson is one of the few Toledoans to have been honored, while still living, by having a school named after him. The Grove Patterson School is located on Middlesex Drive between Ilger and Marvin Avenues. Patterson died from a heart attack in 1956 at the age of 74.
