Liberty Center – Liberty Township, Henry County

Metamora – Amboy Township, Fulton County

Swan Creek – Now non-existent, in 1839 was possibly a post office in Providence Township, Lucas County

Tedrow – Also known as Spring Hill. Dover Township, Fulton County

Tremainsville – Now non-existent, was once a post office at the present-day junction of Collingwood Boulevard and Detroit Avenue
