

## Gideon K. and Zebulon C. Pheatt Collection Biographical and Contents Notes

Gideon Kelsey Pheatt and Zebulon Converse Pheatt were the two oldest sons of Isaac Tichenor and Ermina (Frink) Pheatt. They were born in Cape Vincent, New York, Gideon in 1831 and Zebulon the next year. The family moved to Toledo about 1837.

Gideon owned a gun store and was known for the hunting rifles he sold as well as being a notable hunter. He died on March 21, 1895 leaving his widow, Anna, one daughter and seven sons.

Zebulon was a partner in a wholesale grocery firm for many years. He was also treasurer and then secretary of the Adams Street Railway Company. He died on July 6, 1901 leaving his widow, Augusta, one son and one daughter. Two children died in childhood.

Most of the entries in the letterbook are from Zebulon and comprise business correspondence. The letters in Folder 2 all appear to deal with land transactions in Michigan.
